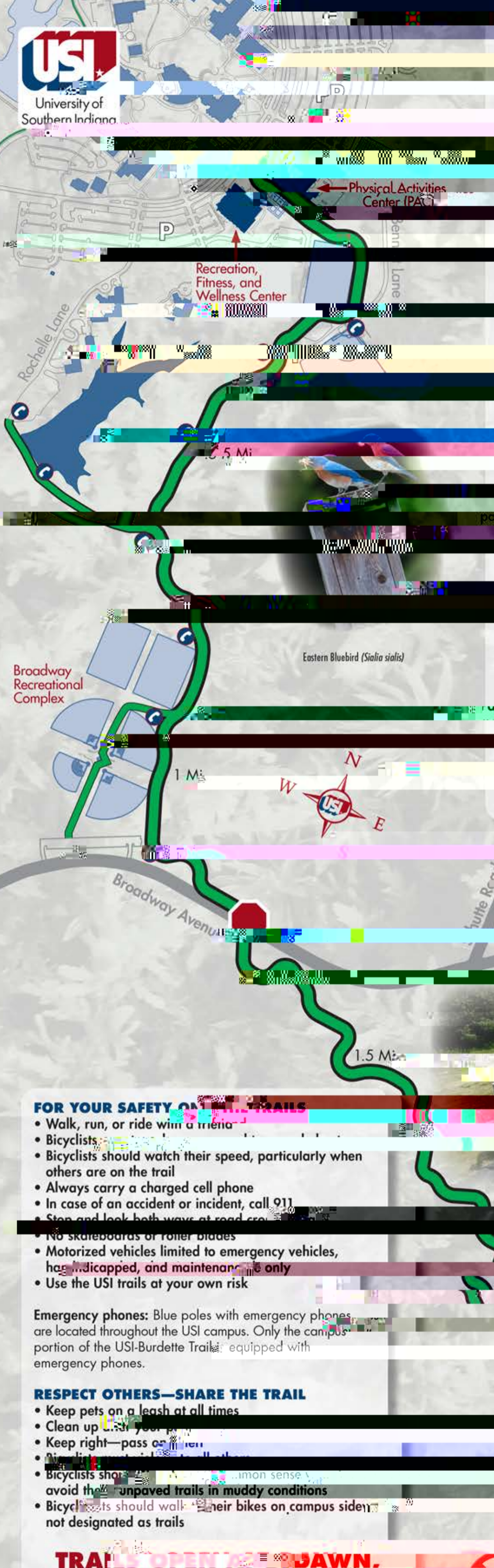


TRAIL INFORMATION

FOR YOUR SAFETY ON THE TRAILS

- Walk, run, or ride with a friend
- Bicyclists

- Stop and look both ways at road crossings
- No skateboards or roller blades
- Motorized vehicles limited to emergency vehicles, handicapped, and maintenance only
- Use the USI trails at your own risk

Emergency phones: Blue poles with emergency phones are located throughout the USI campus. Only the campus portion of the USI-Burdette Trail is equipped with emergency phones.

RESPECT OTHERS—SHARE THE TRAIL

- Keep pets on a leash at all times
- Clean up after your pet
- Keep right—pass on the left
- Bicyclists should use common sense
- Avoid the unpaved trails in muddy conditions
- Bicyclists should walk their bikes on campus sidewalks not designated as trails
